Sports Premium Review for September 2018 - September 2019

How to use the PE and sport premium (Government Guidance)

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

For example, you can use your funding to:

- Hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers.
- Provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively.
- Introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport.
- Support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs.
- Run sport competitions.
- Increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#).
- Run sports activities with other schools.

You should not use your funding to:

- Employ coaches or specialist teachers to cover planning preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements - these should come out of your core staffing budgets
- Teach the minimum requirements of the national curriculum - including those specified for swimming (or, in the case of academies and free schools, to teach your existing PE curriculum).

Anticipated funding for this academic year from the sports premium is £16,000 plus an additional £10 per child on role. **Total = £17,230**

The remaining balance from the academic year 2017-2018 is **£10,511**

Total allocation for sports premium funding = **£27,741**

We will receive a similar amount for the academic year 2019 - 2020 although this may fluctuate slightly due to numbers on roll.

Analysis

Curriculum PE

- We continue to maintain close links with the Poulton Cluster, Fleetwood Town and Wyre & Fylde partnership to arrange competitive sporting opportunities for children in KS2 and KS1.
- We are now mostly assessing the children using the Lancashire scheme of work for both KS1 and KS2. Using the Lancashire core tasks staffs are now held more accountable for their children's development.
- We continue to employ JC Dance Company to provide the children with good quality dance tuition as well as providing the staff with a model of how to teach dance in the future. Alongside this she has established cross-curriculum links through the scheme of work.
- Maths of the day has also been purchased to help raise the profile of maths through physical activity. This seems to have been very successful so far and is allowing us to achieve the governments recommended extra 30 minutes a day.

Swimming

Additional swimmers were sent to Poulton baths during the summer term to ensure that as many KS2 children as possible reach the standard of 25m unaided. At the end of the academic year 85.2% of children (52 out of 61) in Years 4, 5 and 6 achieved the standard. In Year 6, 85% of children (17 out of 20) successfully reached the governments standards to be able to swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres, use a range of strokes effectively and perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

Children's Input to PE

The children were consulted through the use of a questionnaire regarding their attitude, participation and preferences in PE. This has allowed us to plan and develop our programme of lessons and clubs for this academic year.

Competitive Sport

- The school's football team have had a good season with some encouraging performances; and successfully competed in two tournaments, having a good run in both.
- Eight children from KS1 successfully competed in the multi skills festival finishing second.
- Sixteen children from KS2 competed at the Inter-Schools Athletics competition at Stanley Park during the summer term, finishing fourth.

- Twelve children from KS2 competed at the indoor Sportshall Athletics competition during the autumn term, which we won and went through to the small schools' finals which we performed well.
 - Ten children competed in the swimming gala in which we performed well.
- In total 42 children (36% of school) represented school, in competitive events, across the Wyre and Fylde area last year.

Playground

We are exploring ways of improving the playground structures including extending the rubber matting and adding new playground markings to enable the children to be more physically active as well as providing a lasting legacy for the sports premium funding. We have spent time and money on improving the outdoor classroom which will be completed this calendar year - enabling children and teachers to have an extra space outside.

Actions

- A wider variety of clubs needs to be offered as part of our extra-curricular programme - we have spoken about a new speed stacking club to start.
- Children in Y4 and Y5 not reaching the swimming standard need to be identified and targeted for extra swimming.
- More opportunities to compete outside of school need to be explored.
